...Gordon Parks: Part One at Alison Jacques Gallery

Alison Jacques Gallery is staging the first solo show of Gordon Parks' work to be held in London for over 25 years. Parks was a humanitarian with a deep and life-long commitment to social justice, and the images in this powerful exhibition will explore two defining stories, *Segregation in the South* (1956) and *Black Muslims* (1963). The visionary images that constitute both these series offered visibility to often marginalised, anonymous families and misrepresented figures in American society at large.
